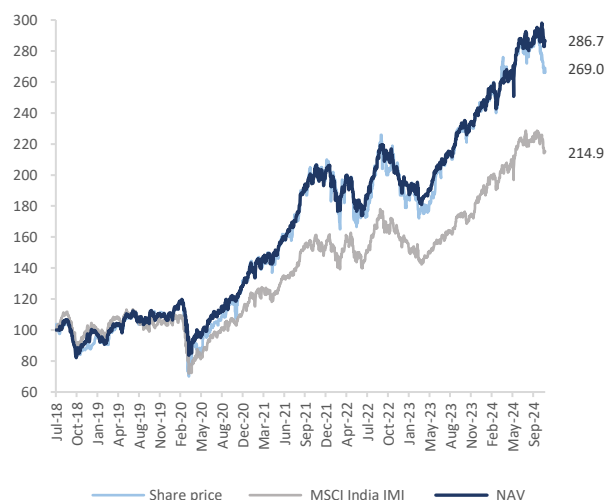

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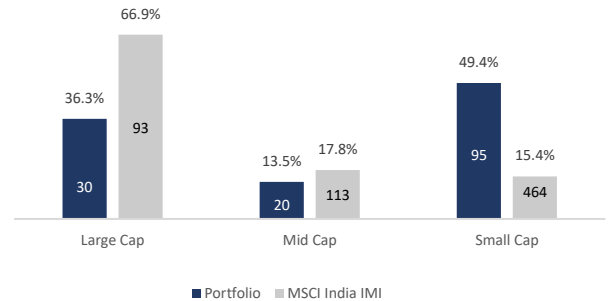

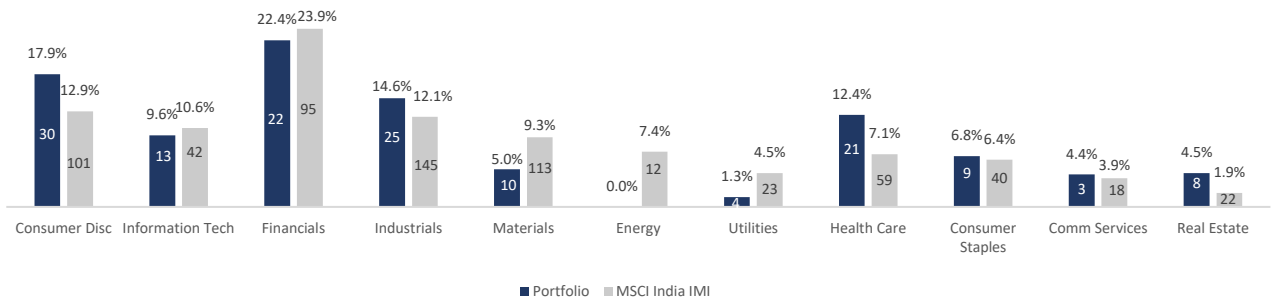

Market Review

In October 2024, the MSCI India IMI index was down 4.5%. It underperformed other global indices like MSCI EM, the US equities (S&P 500), and MSCI World, which returned -0.4%, 3.2%, and 2.1%, respectively.

In October 2024, Foreign Institutional investors (FIIs) were net sellers to the tune of US\$10.4bn, while net buying by domestic institutional investors (DIIs) was US\$12.8bn. For the month, the Rupee appreciated by 2.9% vs the GBP, while the 10-year G-Sec yields rose from 6.75% to 6.83%. Commodities rallied, with Brent and S&P GSCI Industrial Metals Index up 6.3% and 1.6%, respectively.

For the month, Health Care, Financials and Information Technology outperformed, while Consumer Staples, Energy, and Consumer Discretionary underperformed. Large caps have underperformed mid and small caps, while State-owned entities underperformed their private peers.

Performance Review

The Fund was down 1.27% in October 2024, outperforming the benchmark by 323bps. The key contributors were Neuland Laboratories (+22.7%), KRN Heat Exchanger (+111.8%), and Gopal Snacks (+20.5%), whereas Nestle (-12.5%), Cholamandalam Fin. Holdings (-12.5%), and Titan (-11.1%) were the key detractors.
